Recidivism

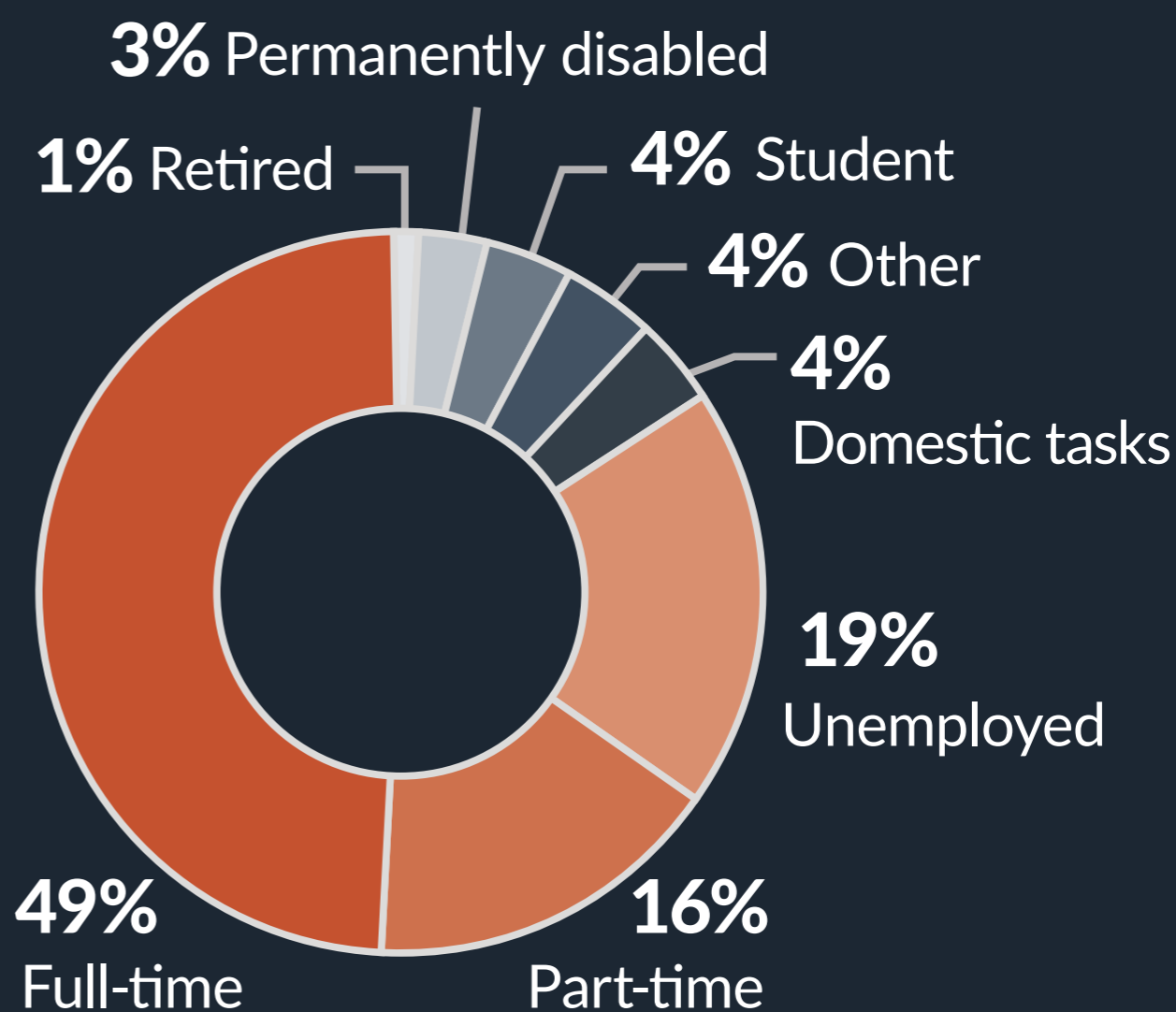
In 2014, **73%** of incarcerated adults were **previously incarcerated**.



Previous Employment

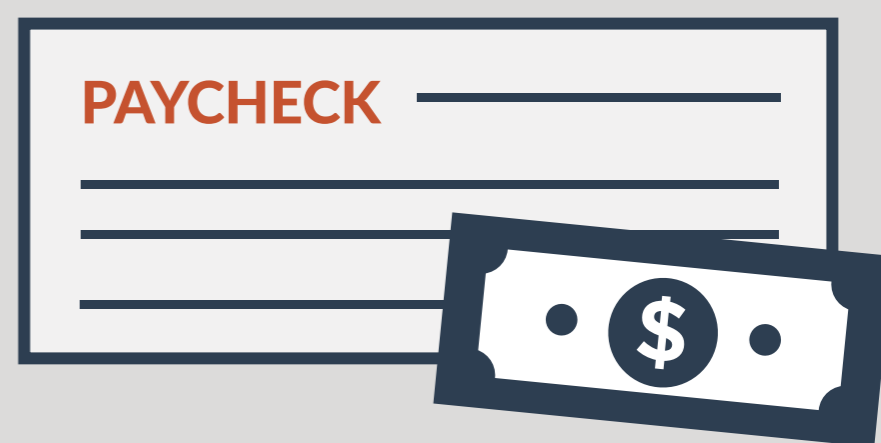


Prior to their most recent incarceration, **nearly half of incarcerated adults were employed full-time.**¹



Income Sources Prior to Incarceration

The **majority of incarcerated adults made money from paid jobs** prior to incarceration.²



68% Paid jobs

27% Family or friends

23% Illegal sources

8% Social Security or other pension(s)

8% Welfare or charity

6% Other

4% Educational scholarship or grant

3% Unemployment insurance or workman's compensation
