



RTI Goals Related to Addressing Disproportionality and the Achievement Gap

- Close achievement gap between students from culturally/linguistically diverse backgrounds and their peers
- Provide coordinated early intervening supports in order to prevent escalation of learning or behavioral challenges
- Reduce inappropriate identification of students to special education
