Using Data to Guide Action for Vocational Rehabilitation Administration is the first in a planned series of webinars for state vocational rehabilitation (VR) personnel by American Institutes for Research, a not-for-profit organization engaged in research, development, evaluation, and analysis in the behavioral and social sciences.

Data are a result of our priorities and practices in VR and describe our performance to community, state, and federal stakeholders. Data play a key role in accountability and can be used to show the impact of investments in VR at both the individual and system levels.
